### **The Expenses of Bird Care – A Surprising Reality**

Many people are taken aback by the costs associated with bird ownership, especially since they were previously promoted as inexpensive and low-maintenance pets.

When assessing your ability to commit to bird care, consider the following expenses:

- Veterinary care – Annual health check-ups are essential for all adopted birds.
- Quality housing.
- Enrichment.
- Grooming.
- Diet.

You can potentially reduce veterinary costs by implementing proactive health care strategies, such as offering a balanced diet and ample enrichment opportunities.

### **Time**

Birds are sociable creatures that thrive on daily interactions, companionship, and established routines. Certain species form monogamous pairs and often spend their time in sizeable flocks.

It's essential to dedicate time each day to engage with your bird, as this will foster a rewarding relationship that can last a lifetime — some birds can live for over 100 years! Therefore, it's crucial to ensure you can commit to your bird's lifespan and make arrangements for its care in your absence.

### **Diet for Birds**

Birds require a diverse diet that is abundant in vitamins and minerals. Relying solely on dry seed diets, which are often high in fat and deficient in essential nutrients, has been shown to lead to various health and behavioural problems. High quality seeds should typically be offered as treats alongside a balanced diet of pellets, fresh fruits, and vegetables.

### **Important Notes:**

- Avoid toxic foods such as avocado, chocolate, and coffee, as these should never be given to birds.
- Always provide fresh, clean water to captive birds.

### **Enrichment for Birds**

In the wild, birds dedicate most of their day to solving problems, foraging for food, interacting with foliage, grooming, and socialising with other birds. Similarly, birds in captivity require daily mental and physical stimulation to prevent boredom and promote learning.

As the caregiver, it's essential to provide your bird with a variety of perches in different sizes (including natural branches), foliage and flowers for chewing and climbing, captive foraging devices, and non-toxic toys that are regularly rotated.

### **Maintaining a Healthy Environment for Your Bird**

Harmful bacteria often thrive in dirty and unhygienic spaces, making regular cleaning essential to ensure a safe and healthy home for your feathered friend.

Certain species, like Sulphur-crested Cockatoos and Galahs, have powdery feathers that can quickly spread dander dust throughout your living areas, increasing your cleaning responsibilities.

Basic daily care tasks include, but are not limited to:

- Changing the cage paper lining.
- Cleaning food and water cups, toys, and the cage itself using an avian-friendly (non-toxic) cleaning product, such as Vetafarm Avi-care or vinegar combined with warm water.
- Replacing or cleaning soiled and damaged perches and toys.
- Providing fresh branches, foliage, and flowers.

### **Grooming Guidelines for Birds**

Grooming procedures, such as nail trimming and wing clipping, are sometimes necessary. However, these tasks should only be carried out by a skilled and experienced handler. Attempting to perform these procedures yourself can harm the bond between you and your bird.

Flight is a crucial adaptation for birds, allowing them to escape from fear-inducing stimuli. Removing this ability (for instance, through excessive unilateral wing clipping) can heighten the risk of fear-driven aggression, which is seldom observed in the wild.

SOS ILLAWARRA Bird Sanctuary & Rescue supports light bilateral wing clipping in certain situations. The purpose of this approach is to enable the bird to fly at approximately half its normal height and speed, thereby reducing the risk of injury within the home and chances of escape.

### **Space Considerations for Bird Cages**

A suitably sized cage can occupy a considerable amount of space in your home. When selecting a bird cage, ensure that it allows the bird to stretch its wings freely without any obstacles. The cage should include:

- At least two perches.
- Three bowls for food, water and fresh food.
- Enrichment items such as toys, foraging devices, and foliage.

These elements contribute to a comfortable and stimulating environment for your feathered friend.

## Understanding Noise Vocalisation in Birds

Noise vocalisation is a natural behaviour that should be anticipated. Most birds can produce loud calls, some of which are melodious, while others may be less pleasing to human ears. These vocalisations are not limited to wild birds; excessive vocalisation is a frequent behavioural concern for birds in captivity.

To help mitigate this issue, it's important to educate yourself on **positive behaviour modification techniques** and **captive foraging**. If you're uncertain about how to proceed, consider reaching out to us for advice guidance.

## SOS ILLAWARRA Bird Sanctuary & Rescue: Commitment to Avian Adoption and Colonising of surrendered birds.

At SOS ILLAWARRA Bird Sanctuary & Rescue, we are deeply committed to the adoption and colonising of the birds that have been surrendered to us. It is crucial for our organisation, the new caregiver, and the bird itself that the proper procedures are adhered to.

## Standards of Care at SOS

SOS adheres to the following care standards:

- **Health Examination:** Birds deemed appropriate for rehoming and colonising by SOS always undergo a thorough health examination.
- **Blood Testing:** For birds at risk, a blood test for PBFD is conducted by an avian veterinarian or through our primary sponsor, Atlantis Pets.

## High quality, balanced seed and formulated Diet

The bird will be transitioned to a quality balanced seed and formulated diet consisting of Murphy's or Vetafarm quality pellets and Forage bird food. It is anticipated that any caregiver will offer this same diet, along with fresh foods, throughout the bird's lifetime.

## Grooming Services:

- Bathing
- Nail Clipping
- Wing Clipping and Wing Corrections

## Behaviour Modification

Addressing prevalent behavioural challenges such as screaming, biting, and destructive feather plucking — which are often seen in surrendered birds — while ensuring ongoing behavioural assessments carried out by staff.

## Enrichment

- Stimulating and non-toxic toys: Focus being on tactile and visual enrichment.
- Foraging opportunities: Providing a variety of food options, including pellets, fruits, vegetables, and nuts (offered as treats only) for dietary enrichment.
- Social interaction: Ensuring plenty of scratches and cuddles for social enrichment.
- Exercise: Allowing supervised time outside of their cage for physical activity.

**Rehoming Fee**

I understand and agree that the rehoming/adoption fee is non-refundable, under any circumstances.

**Right of First Refusal**

If its decided the bird can no longer be cared for by you, SOS Illawarra Bird Sanctuary & Rescue retains the right of first refusal, which includes situations involving desired release, selling, transferring ownership, or in the event of your passing.
